# **UMFA Retirement Allowance Program**

The next deadline for the <u>UMFA Retirement Allowance Program</u> is June 30, 2017. The Retirement Allowance Program is a voluntary plan offering a full or partial basic allowance to eligible members, dependent upon his/her age and the number of advance years of notice given to the University prior to retirement. #### **Anomalies Fund**

The Joint University/UMFA Anomalies Committee is now taking applications to correct anomalies in base salaries of UMFA Members. The University/UMFA collective agreement establishes a fund of \$100,000 to correct anomalies in base salaries for each contract year. In this round the joint committee will consider applications for the 2016-17 contract period. Members of UMFA as of **March 31, 2016** are eligible to apply. Salary adjustments will normally be made retroactive to April 1, 2016.

Salary data on UMFA Members, including rank, years in rank, department, and other relevant criteria, can be reviewed in the UMFA office between the dates of August 7 and September 8, 2017. Please call UMFA at 474-8562 to make an appointment.
